During the first half term of the Spring Term at St James and St John, we will be studying a range of different faiths, including Judaism, Buddhism and Hinduism. In the second half term, the children will be studying a topic with a Christian theme. The children will take the time, this term, to write prayers for their individual prayer books on Lent and Easter.

Help your child to find out about the religion they are studying in class by using books from the library and websites.

Year 1	CHRISTIANITY – Why is Easter the most important festival for Christians?

SUGGESTIONS FOR HOME ACTIVITIES

As a family talk about forgiveness and why and how we need this quality in our lives. Ask your children to tell you the Easter story and the meaning of Jesus' death for all mankind. Find out about Shrove Tuesday, Lent and why a cross of ashes is marked on the forehead on Ash Wednesday.

THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST IN THE TEMPLE (Candlemas)

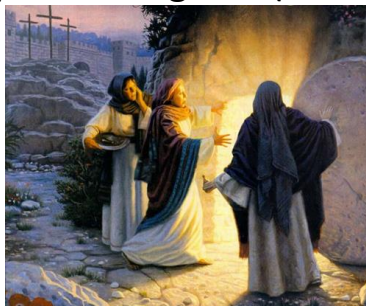
(2nd February)
